American Red Cross: 39 families/11 people-Families/Clients of disaster received assistance or aid referrals. 31 Military/Individuals/Families received Armed Forces Emergency Communications or Services. 305 Individuals participated in Disaster Prevention and Training Classes. 761 Adults participated in CPR/FA, health/safety classes or presentations. 144 Youth participated in health/safety classes or presentations. 1,199 Individuals received lifesaving information about services and preparedness. 3,894 Residents donated blood.

Big Brothers Big Sisters: Provided one-to-one traditional mentoring to 38 children. In school-based mentoring provided 111 children with one-to-one mentoring at 12 different schools. Trained 22 new mentors for the traditional program. Provided match support for 12 on-going matches. Trained 79 for our school-based program. Support 1 traditional mentor from St. Joseph. These mentors provided thousands of hours of one-to-one mentoring. Prairie Center Health Systems: 75 youth received programming through presentation of the Too Good For Drugs curriculum at the Danville YMCA and Young Men Aware/Young Women Aware programs through Big Brothers Big Sisters at Southview Middle School and the Big Brother Big Sister's facility. This includes programming throughout the school year, as well as programming during the summer months. Additional topics/activities were presented during the summer months, which included substance abuse education and general life skills.
